It is wonderful to work with our donors on a daily basis to think strategically about how we can tackle issues together. And how we can each have as much impact as possible.

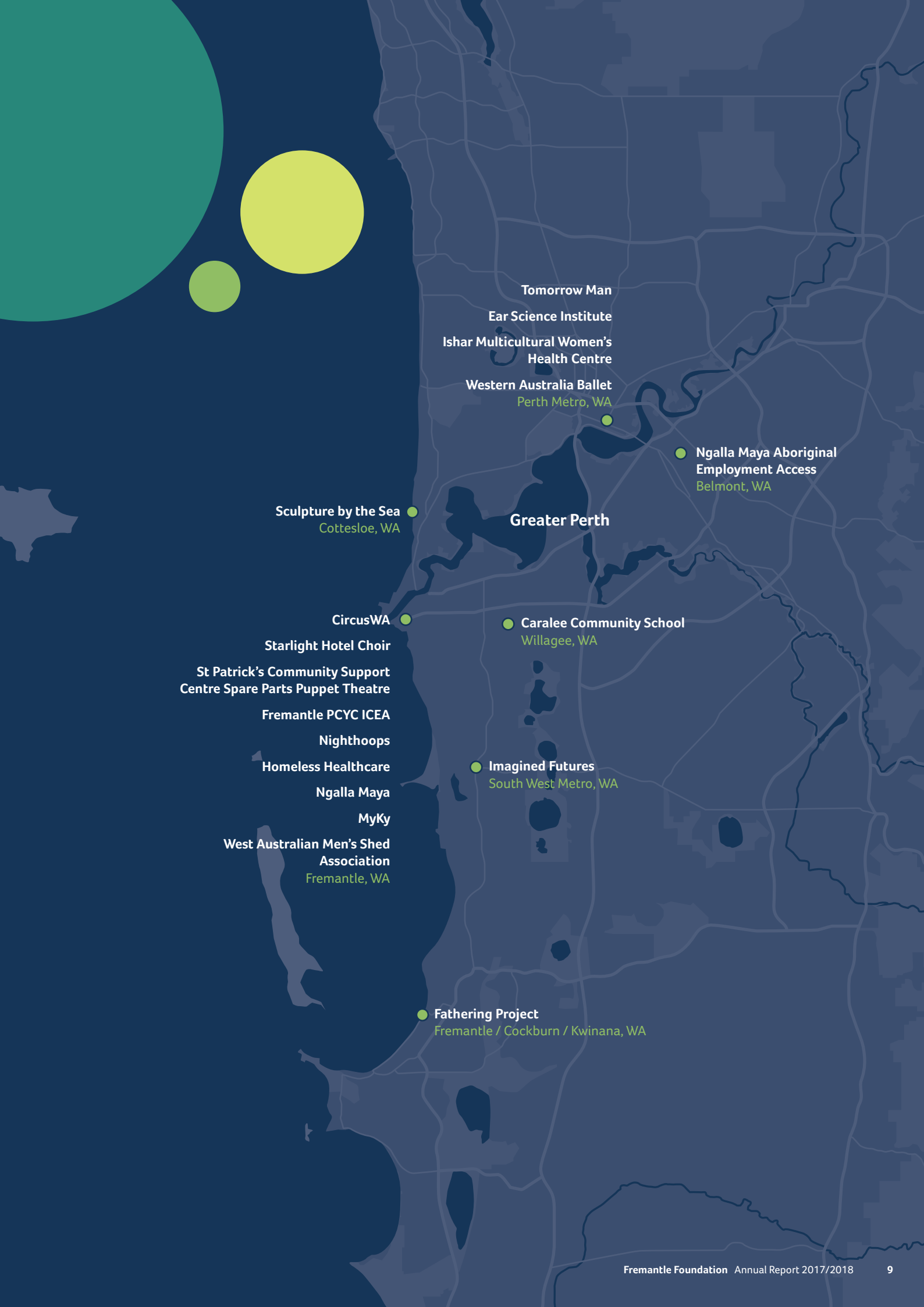
With 47 Named Funds now established by individuals, families and business or groups with the Fremantle Foundation, the combined contributions are making a significant difference.

Funding Pilot Programs

Carter Family Fund

The Carter Family Fund was established by Craig and Cora Carter to support emerging community needs with a focus on Education. This year one of the projects the Carter Family Fund supported was a 20 week pilot Breakfast Club program run by Fremantle PCYC.

The program provides breakfast lunch and recess twice a week and also included literacy and numeracy workshops and a morning fitness program run by a Youth Worker.

The Youth Workers within the program have developed strong relationships with local school to help support increasing school attendance. The average school attendance during the beginning of the pilot was 88.5 %, this increased by 3.9% to 92.4% towards the end the end of the program.

SISTER2sister is youth development program that provides mentoring and crisis intervention services to vulnerable or disadvantaged teenage girls (Little Sisters) aged 12 years and up.



ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE AUSTRALIA

Environmental Justice Australia is challenging in the Federal Court whether logging in endangered species habitat can continue to have a special exemption from Federal environmental law, under Regional Forest Agreements. If successful this challenge will have national ramifications, paving the way for challenges to the other Regional Forest Agreements, currently expiring around Australia.



HUMAN RIGHTS LAW CENTRE

In 2018, Australia began a three-year term the UN Human Rights Council. The Human Rights Law Centre has a long history of using the UN system to directly improve human rights outcomes on the ground. Funding supports a dedicated Director of Legal Advocacy to deepen their impact during this crucial three-year window.

TAMS Group Fund

TAMS Group is an innovative marine and harbour services organisation based in Fremantle. TAMS is committed to the community in which they operate, and are passionate about being able to make a positive contribution to society.

TAMS Group have established the TAMS Group Fund with a focus on supporting community projects. The fund allows TAMS employees to nominate community organisations they are passionate about to receive grants. In 2017/18 the TAMS Group Fund chose to support the Saba Rose Button Foundation.

The Saba Rose Button Foundation is a not-for-profit charity focussed on raising funds to help children who have special needs and their families. The funds raised will pay for these special children to participate in 'intensive blocks' of physiotherapy, for specialised equipment that is needed, for parental respite and for care in the home.

Impact100 Fremantle

The Fremantle Foundation has hosted the Impact100 Fremantle giving group since 2013.

In a remarkable show of community spirit and generosity Impact100 Fremantle donors have united to give \$590,000 in donations to Fremantle charities.

The group asks for members to contribute \$1,000 annually. Then the donations are pooled together to create a game-changing grant of \$100,000. All donors are invited into the decision making process and vote to decide the winner.



Ngalla Maya

Supporting each candidate in their journey

Ngalla Maya is a not-for-profit organisation taking a holistic approach to closing the gap between Indigenous and non-Indigenous Australians. First Nations people make up 3% of the Australian population but represent 43% of the prison population in Western Australia.

Ngalla Maya addresses core social problems that lead to disparity and work to inspire and commit former inmates to training and education opportunities that lead to employment. They support each candidate in their journey into training, employment, ongoing mentoring and support; all of this occurs while also supporting the family unit.

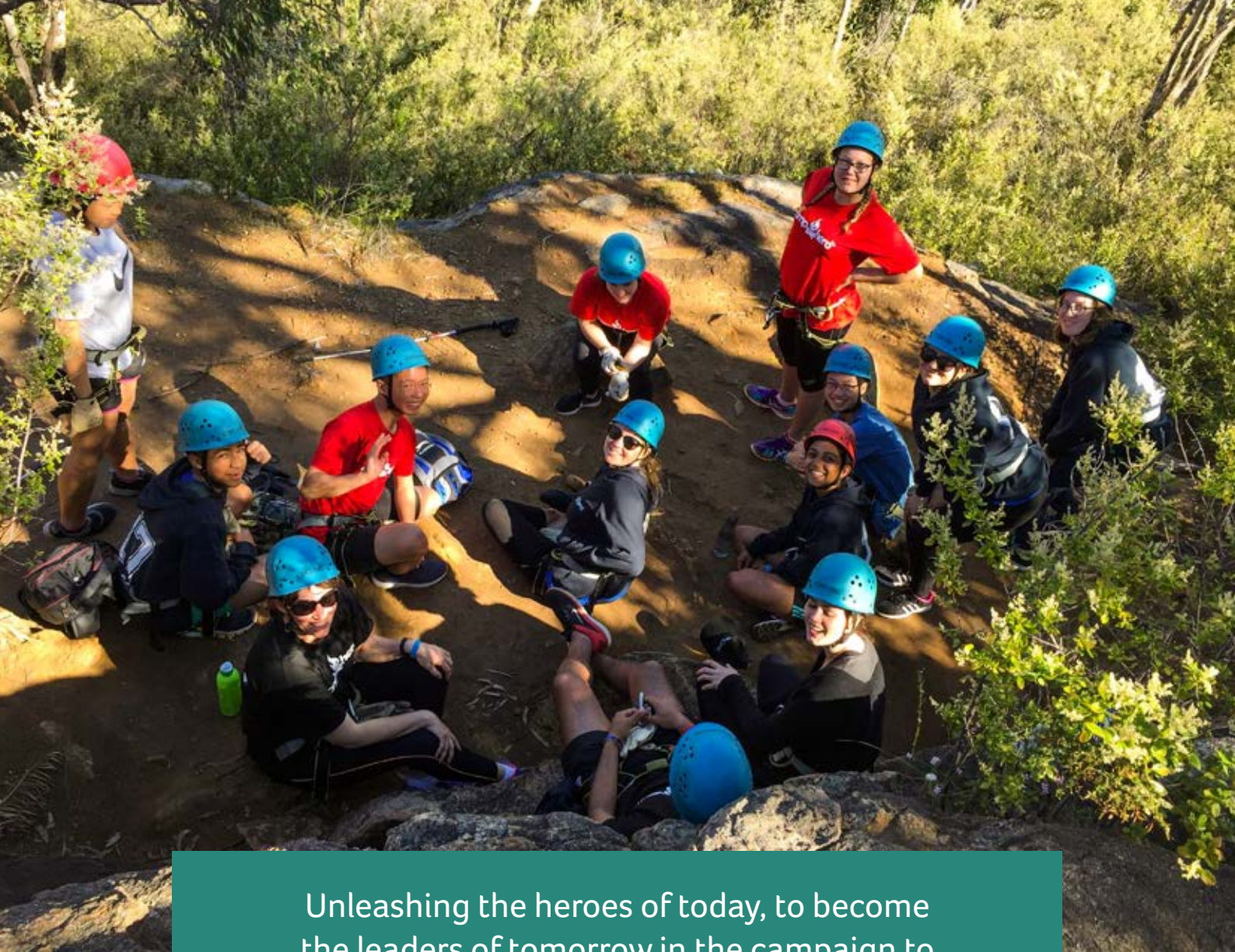
Jin Memorial Initiative

The Jin Memorial Initiative was started by Kwong Lew and Liew Lew as a memorial fund for their son, Jin-Boon Lew. The impact area of the fund is Community Social Entrepreneurship with a focus on young adults and refugees.

In 2018 they supported **zero2hero** Camp Hero Mental Health and Leadership Program.

zero2hero is WA based and dedicated to increasing the understanding of mental health issues and the awareness of mental health services among children and young people through innovative programs, events, and education. Events such as Camp Hero equip school-aged children and teenagers with the skills to speak up when they are struggling and the confidence to stand up and support their friends when they may be experiencing stress, anxiety, depression, bullying, selfharm or suicidal thoughts. Their programs aim to unleash the heroes of today, to become the leaders of tomorrow in the campaign to promote good mental health throughout their communities.

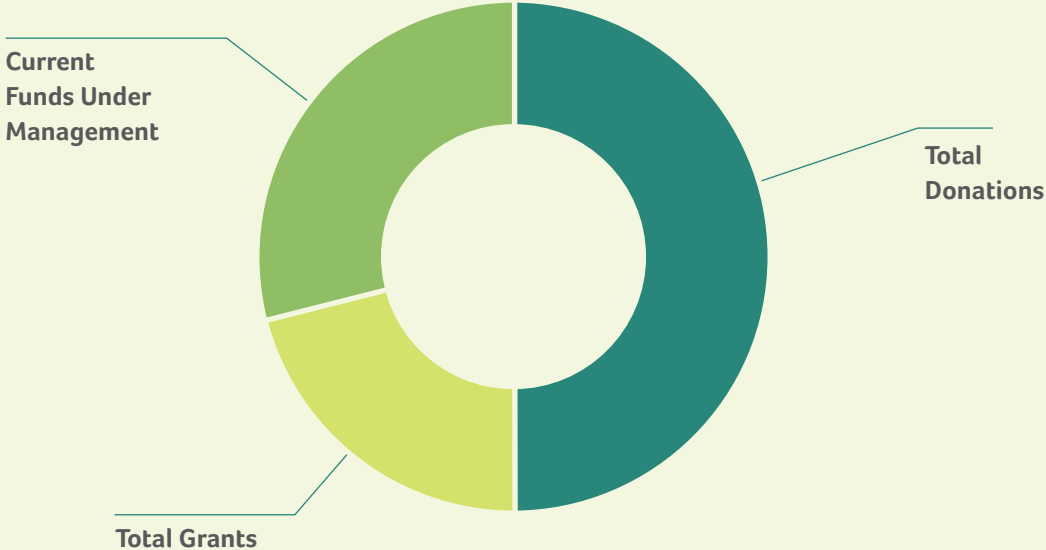

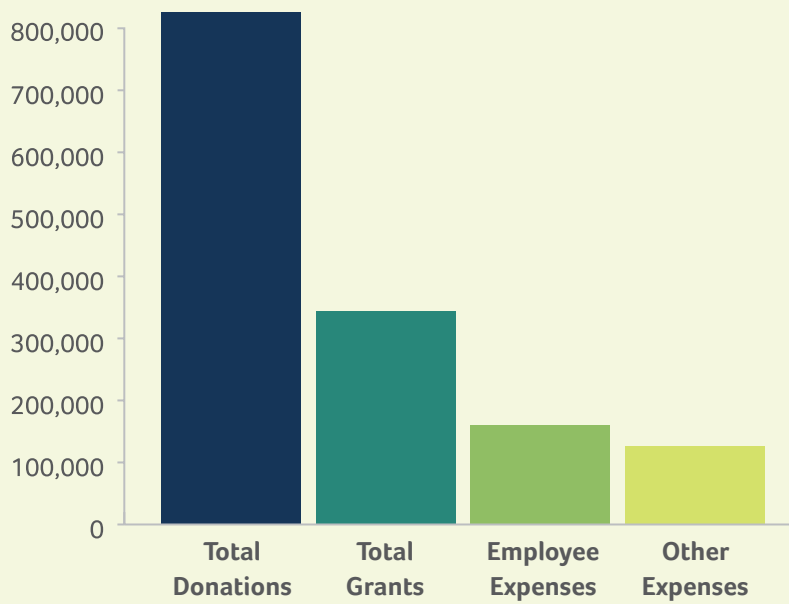

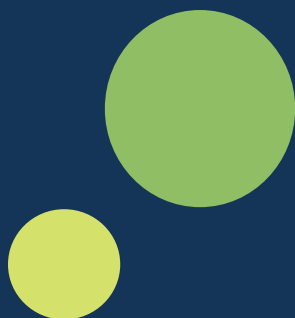
